

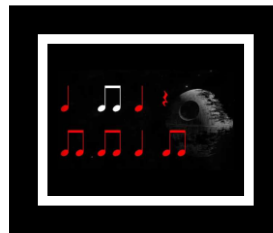

WCET Lesson 2 w/c 18 January 2021

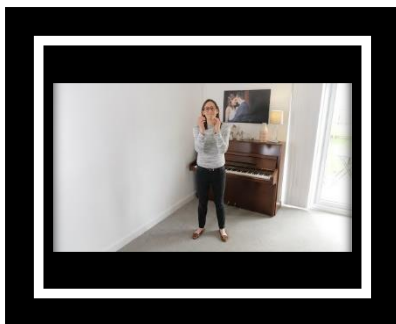

Top Tips!

- Lightly Row is a German Folk Song - listen to the backing track and see if you can sing along with the melody...

Lightly Row, Lightly Row
O'er the glassy waves we go
Lightly Row, Lightly Row
On the silent tide

- This piece uses the open D & A strings - keep a steady beat and read ahead to know when to move between the D and A strings.
- Pluck the string firmly with a fleshy fingertip to create a ringing sound.
- Be careful that you don't play in the rests - try saying 'sshhh'.
- When you are confident playing this piece pizzicato, why not come back and try playing it arco?
