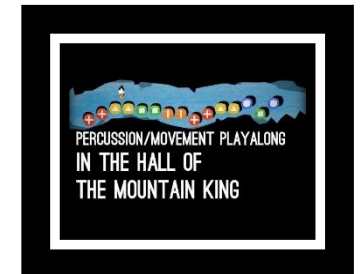

## **New Music - Walking Strings**

Top Tips!

- Try to read ahead in the music so you know which note to play next - look where you are going, like on a walk!
- *Walking Strings* is another piece which uses three open string notes; they are G, D & A
- Try to stop in time and listen carefully, so there is a silent fourth beat in every bar.


