Top Tips!

- Try to read ahead in the music so you know which note to play next look where you are going, like on a walk!
- Walking Strings is another piece which uses three open string notes, they are G, D & A
- Try to stop in time and listen carefully, so there is a silent fourth beat in every bar.
- If you can play Walking Strings pizzicato play it again arco!








